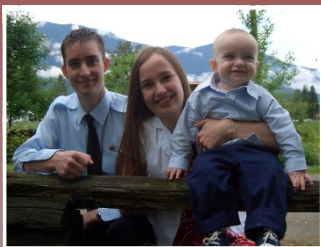

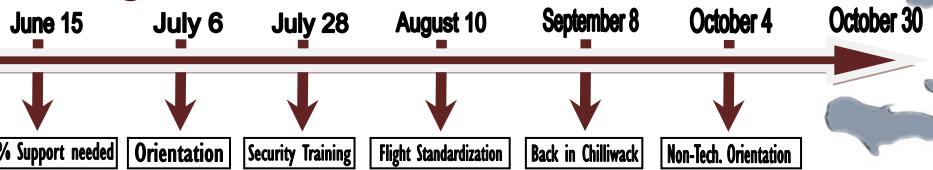

Flights can become routine on some days, but there are times when a special call comes to medevac someone from a remote area to the capital to save their life. Not too long ago, MAF Pilot David Carwell was called on an emergency medical evacuation of a woman with life-threatening injuries. The drive from where she lives to Port-au-Prince would have taken 8-10 bone-jarring hours. Thankfully, MAF was able to transport her, along with a doctor to keep her stable inflight, in less than 30 minutes to the airport where an ambulance was waiting. Because of your support, MAF was able to make this flight.
