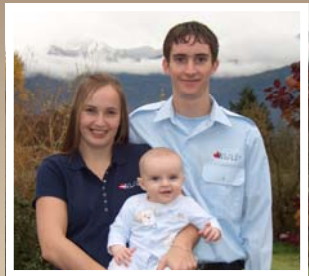

Our Journey Has Begun . . .

Now that we have been officially accepted by Mission Aviation Fellowship, we have the privilege of sending out our first news letter! Through this news letter we hope to keep everyone updated on what is happening during our pre-field preparations, current support level and eventually, the Lord willing, our experiences on the mission field. Jason is currently working full-time as a flight instructor to reach the 1000 hour minimum that many of the countries MAF works in requires. As of today he has 950 hours and

he is hoping to reach the 1000 hour mark before January. Since we need to build a monthly financial support team to sustain us while on the field, we are also busy working on writing letters, handing out partnership forms and getting together with family, friends and acquaintances to raise awareness and ask for support for the ministry of MAF. In January we will be attending a three month cross-cultural training program at Gateway Missionary Training Center in Langley, B.C. This coming summer we hope to

go to Nampa, Idaho where Jason is required to undergo technical flight training. As part of this training he will practice landing on small, difficult, dirt landing strips to prepare him for the flying he will be doing overseas. After this we may also be required to undergo six to eight months of language training, depending on if we will be sent to a non-English speaking country. Since there is a lot going on in the next year we hope to send out our newsletter every 2 months. Please continue to pray for us as we begin this journey.

Our Stay in Ontario

From October 29 to November 9 we participated in candidacy orientation in Guelph Ontario. Although this was a very busy and somewhat challenging time we really enjoyed our stay. We attended classes everyday from 8:30 to about 4:00 p.m. We had a break for dinner and then spent the evening doing homework. Two volunteers babysat Jayden and another little baby named Jacob while

we attended our classes, something we really appreciated. We very quickly became close to the other candidates and the MAF staff and are grateful for the opportunity to get to know them all better! Some highlights of the trip were that Jason's brother and family came twice to visit us. They moved to Ontario last summer and it was great seeing them again! On Saturday we

had time to visit Niagara Falls and we stayed by Uncle Jan and Aunt Gayle Neels on the weekend which we also really enjoyed!

MAF's Work in Africa

In Africa, MAF flights support all kinds of organizations, including World Vision, Wycliffe Bible Translators, and Doctors without Borders, which address the spiritual needs, as well as the physical needs of the people. Why is MAF so important when it comes to mission work in Africa? Ground travel is often difficult, dangerous, and slow due to the poor state of roads and lack of security. On a daily basis, MAF is the lifeline that flies doctors, missionaries, food, supplies and medicine to places of deepest human need. MAF is also

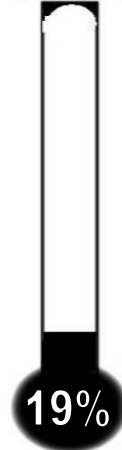
present during Africa's emergencies. In the aftermath of Madagascar's cyclone, during Ebola outbreaks in the Democratic Republic of Congo, and political unrest in Northern Uganda, MAF flew thousands of relief and evacuation flights when no other type of transportation was safe or fast enough. Although we are not sure where exactly we will be sent, we do know it most likely will be Africa. What will we be doing wherever God will direct us to? As a pilot, Jason will be flying doctors, missionaries,

IT specialists, food, medicine and supplies in and out of remote villages. In case of medical emergencies he will also do Medivac flights, which means he will be flying sick and or injured people out of places where there is no medical help and bringing them to hospitals. Willemien's responsibilities include supporting Jason, taking care of our son Jayden, hospitality for visitors and locals, and whatever opportunities there are to help out.

How You Can Help!

We are excited to be a part of this ministry, but we can't go alone. We need a team to come along side us. MAF has asked us to raise a minimum of \$ **5,700** a month to sustain us in the ministry and a sizeable outgoing amount to get us to the field. So far we are at approximately \$**1,100** per month, this means that we still need another \$**4,600!**
